BHATHUKAMMA CELEBRATION:

Bathukamma is a vibrant and culturally significant floral festival celebrated in the state of Telangana, India. It is dedicated to Goddess Gauri, symbolizing prosperity, fertility, and the strength of womanhood. The festival usually takes place during the Durga Navratri period, culminating on Durgashtami. Women create elaborate floral arrangements, called Bathukammas, using a variety of seasonal flowers, and these are placed in the center for prayers and rituals. The festivities are marked by traditional songs, dances, and the collective spirit of community participation





DIWALI CELEBRATIONS

Diwali, also known as **Deepavali**, is one of the most significant and widely celebrated festivals in India. It symbolizes the victory of light over darkness, good over evil, and knowledge over ignorance.

Lighting Diyas and Candles: Homes and public spaces are illuminated to dispel darkness.

Decorations: Rangoli designs, flowers, and fairy lights adorn homes.

Prayers and Pujas: Devotees perform rituals and offer prayers to Goddess Lakshmi and Lord Ganesha.
